This partnership has already enabled language exchange, technology-driven collaboration, and cultural immersion, enriching learning experiences for students and staff alike.

As we draw the 2024 school year to a close, I want to extend a huge thank you to all DLC staff, students, and families for an absolutely outstanding year of language learning here at DLC and across our 24 different partner schools and their communities.

In Week 4 this term, all DLC teachers and some After-Hours tutors participated in the annual LTANT Conference held at CDU. This year's conference focused on Transformative Technology in Language Classrooms Today and featured keynote speakers from both the international and local community of language teachers.

Term 4 also saw two DLC teachers successfully apply to participate in the Australia-Indonesia BRIDGE Partnership Program. This partnership has provided opportunities for language exchange, technology-driven collaboration, and cultural immersion, enhancing the educational experience for students and teachers at both schools. A special thank you and congratulations to Pak Sahar and Ibu Lasmi, who have facilitated this program, including hosting two visiting teachers from our partner school.





One hundred and fifty students from all participating Darwin Languages Centre (DLC) partner schools, across Darwin, Palmerston, and the rural areas, came together on Thursday evening in Week 8 to celebrate the DLC End of Year Awards Evening.

Students were recognised for either outstanding academic achievement or consistent improvement in language learning. Representatives from the Indonesian Consulate and the Language Teachers Association of the Northern Territory attended, along with families and representatives from each partner school.



The evening highlighted the importance and benefits of learning another language, including strengthening literacy, improving engagement, and developing intercultural understanding and empathy by building personal and social capabilities.

It was also a perfect opportunity to acknowledge the dedicated team of language teachers at the Darwin Languages Centre, who currently work across 24 different schools, impacting the lives of over 5,000 students each week.

All DLC In-School teachers completed the final components of their online training this semester on Understanding and Supporting Positive Behaviour in the Classroom. Their learning continues to strengthen their ability to effectively deliver the language program to over 5,000 students across partner schools each week.

This term, we saw a great turnout for Open Classrooms. Many classes had over 75% parent attendance, with students and families alike engaged and excited to showcase this semester's learning. Activities ranged from cooking to a makeshift shop, to songs and verbal recitals.

Our wonderful Teacher-Librarian, Michelle Turner, has also had a huge term delivering NT Education Library services to all schools in the NT. Michelle has been working very closely with many schools in the Top End region, including partnering with Malak Primary School, where she has been piloting a library skills program to show its impact on boosting literacy levels. We can't wait to see the growth from this school and share their journey with others.

This week, we also farewelled two of our wonderful In-School teachers. I'd like to thank Ibu Rika for bringing her wealth of experience and passion for teaching Bahasa Indonesia to the partner schools she has worked at since joining DLC in July 2023, including Essington, Sacred Heart, Howard Springs, Karama, Moil, Gray, and Moulden. Ibu Rika, we wish you all the very best in your future endeavors.







Thank you also to Clayton, who has worked closely with Zoe to build the Auslan program. Clayton's passion for teaching Auslan began at an early age, and he has been committed to helping students learn by breaking down barriers to communication and giving them the tools to understand and express themselves. Clayton has taught a class in the After-Hours program, as well as Year 5/6s at Zuccoli and Year 1-6 at Leanyer Primary School over the last two years. 



























Sticker Champs: Celebrating Achievement in Italian and French Classes

A Season of Creativity and Culture in Japanese Classes






Term Fees 2025
